US Department of Veterans Affairs Approves Accreditation of the Certified Autism Specialist Program

February 17, 2015 – Jacksonville, Florida – With the ever increasing numbers of individuals being diagnosed with Autism (1:68 Children, CDC 2014), there's little doubt that more Certified Autism Specialists are needed than ever. Recently, the leading autism certification organization in the country, the International Board of Credentialing and Continuing Education Standards (IBCCES), announced that their Certified Autism Specialist Program has been approved for accreditation from the US Department of Veterans Affairs. Former military members who seek to work in fields such as healthcare, civilian police, firefighting and even in education benefit from credentials that highlight their specialized training in working with people with autism such as offered by IBCCES."

According to IBCCES, the certification is very popular among educational professionals like Special Education Teachers, Special Education Directors, School Psychologists, Behavior Specialists, School Counselors, Classroom Teachers, Principals, and School Nurses along with licensed professionals in a wide range of areas including Law Enforcement, Firefighters, First Responders, Speech Language Pathologists, Occupational Therapists, BCBA and ABA Professionals, Physical Therapists, Clinical Social Workers, RN Nurses, and Recreational Therapists. All of these vocations work directly with individuals with Autism and the Autism Specialist Certification allows Veterans and Veteran Spouses a valuable way to set themselves apart in an often very competitive job market.

Experience has shown certifications such as this to be a game changing element to a successful transition to the civilian workforce. Military leaders responsible for transitioning Veterans back into the workforce strongly promote the value to Veterans and Veteran Spouses of pursuing this kind of certification, which shows they have gone above and beyond licensing standards in their chosen vocation to make their resumes as appealing as possible to potential employers.
